TINIKLING

DANCE SUITES

THIS GROUP OF TALENTED INDIVIDUALS HAVE SUCCESSFULLY PORTRAYED FILIPINO HISTORY AND CULTURE THROUGH THE FORM OF DANCE. EACH SUITE COORDINATED THEIR OWN INDIVIDUAL DANCES WITH UNIQUE STORIES THAT DEPICTED THE LIFE AND CULTURE OF THE PHILIPPINES. OUR SUITE COORDINATORS AND DANCERS WORKED TIRELESSLY DAY AND NIGHT AND ARE EXCITED TO SHOWCASE THEIR DANCES TO YOU.

Maria Clara

The Maria Clara suite captures the elegance and charm of the mestiza Filipina as well as the gallantry and boldness of the mestizo Filipino. Courtship, love, and flirtation are all evident in the suite of romantic dances. This suite is named after Maria Clara, a main female character in Jose Rizal's novel.



Imunan

A courtship dance, means jealousy. It depicts a love triangle between two females and one male. The male tries to please both females by dancing with them and giving them attention, and the two girls compete with each other to win him over.

La Estudiantina

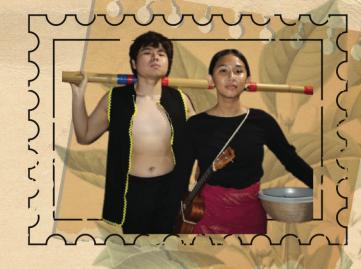
La Estudiantina is a dance capturing women empowerment through education! Young women who were privileged to study at convent schools would be called estudiantinas. This dance is performed with women carrying a book to symbolize education.

In the Lush mountains and forests of Mindinao, the indegenous peoples and their culture is what Lumad Suite represents. For centuries, those people lived lives defined by a peaceful coexistence with nature and among themselves. The Manobo, Subanen, B'laan, T'boli, Talaandig, Tigwahanon and the thirty other ethnic tribes possess a colorful and rich material culture that is surpassed only by their profound sense of spirituality. To be apart of the culture is to be one with nature, and ultimately, with God. This intricate mixture of spirituality and nature has produced a unique culture and ethos that is portrayed through most of the dances.

Makatod

A rite of passage of Tagabawa sub-tribe of Davao-Mandaya. This dance focuses on a young prince who is born high by courtiers and given a place of honor by his people. The male dancers use dried palm frond shredded to tiny separate pieces that give a hissing sound when shaken: this is supposed to mimic the movement of an eagle



Sugod Uno

Sugod Uno, also known as the Bagobo Rice Cycle, is a prayer for the choosing of fertile fields. The men use talapak poles to dig holes into the ground where the women will be placing the grains of rice. Afterwards, the men and women come together to celebrate the completion of the rice cycle.

The mountain region of Northern Luzon, has six tribes, including the two tribes we will be performing dances based on, the Kalinga and Bontoc tribes. The people of the mountain region perform dances or rituals for ceremonies, feasts, and everyday living through the flipping of their hands, swaying of their hips, and tapping off their feet. These dances are commonly accompanied by gangsa (gongs) and other native instruments.



A war dance where the dancers vow revenge for the death of a warrior. This dance performed to stir the courage and strength of headhunters and warriors preparing to attack their enemies.



Sayaw sa Banga

This dance is performed with Kalinga women showing their agility in balancing the Banga, meaning "pot", on top of their heads while toddling through rice paddies and mountain paths; a daily routine to fetch water from the mountain springs. It tells us a story of Filipino women's strength, resilience and grace.

Mindanao

Mindanao, the Philippines' southernmost island, is the country's cultural melting pot. It houses influences from Spain, China, Indonesia, and the Middle East. Tribes such as the T'boli, Bilaan, Manobo, Bagobo, and other groups inhabit the vast regions of Mindanao. What distinguishes them from other tribes in the Philippines is their intricate craftsmanship in metal, clothing, and jewelry. Which is why their dances are characterized by vivid colors and rhythmic movements which reflect the influence of Arabian and Indo-Malaysian cultures.

Kini-Kini

This dance refers to the way Muslim women walk. They have a sense of regal to their walk and use scarves to show the fluidity and softness in their motions.



Sagayan

Sagayan is a martial arts style dance from the Mindanao region. It depicts Prince Bantugan preparing his soldiers for battle and celebrating their victories afterward.

Sarimanok

Sarimanok is a storytelling dance that depicts the Sarimanok, a mythical bird, being chased through the bamboo forest by the Sultan and his soldiers who aim to capture the bird for her beauty.

Rural Sural

The Rural suite, also known as the Barrio suite, represents the Filipino heart and soul. This suite highlights the fiesta spirit, demonstrates the significance of community, and ultimately portrays a love for life. In the Rural suite, you can see a love for music, a sense of community, and gratefulness in the simple things of life.



Pasikat na Baso

Pasikat na baso, pasikat meaning show off and baso meaning drinking glass involves farmer-peasants displaying good balance and graceful movements and to show off their unusual skills in balancing glasses that contain water or cocktailed native drinks (native wine) on their foreheads and hands while atop a bench

Tinikling であますシ

The term "Tinikling" translates to "to be/perform like tikling". Which is a local bird in the Visayas islands under the rail bird species, specifically the slaty-breasted rail (Gallirallus striatus), the buff-banded rail (Gallirallus philippensis), and the barred rail (Gallirallus torquatus).

The dance originated in Leyte. It was created in the likeness of how the tikling birds walk and jump over branches as well as dodge traps set by farmers with its long stilt-like legs.

An urban legend also says that the dance was a form of punishment during the Spanish colonial era, where workers of a plantation who disobeyed orders or worked too slow were made to stand in between two bamboo poles. The poles would then clapped together to beat the feet of the workers. They must jump to avoid the poles.

A division of the Pilipino American Coalition at the California State University Long Beach, was founded by a small group of friends in hopes of using dance as an outlet for expression of today's youth. Originating as a mere pre-show act for PCN in 1995, PAC Modern has grown into an unstoppable force earning a name for themselves within a fierce and competitive dance scene.



PAC Modern displays a wide range of dance styles, such as breaking, house, locking, popping, jazz, new school, and is influenced by various styles, fundamentals and other forms of hip hop. Their performance style and choreography has been known to be unpredictable, influential, creative, and innovating, with routines to prove that the team promotes versatility in dance. Most importantly, PAC Modern commits to entertaining and "wowing" the audience at every performance.

Aside from dancing, the group enjoys hanging out as a FAMILY inside and outside of practice, still manages to continue their education, participate in various community events, as well as maintain strong bonds with their originating club, the Pilipino American Coalition, embracing their culture, and establishing friendships within the performance/competitive dance scene community. PAC Modern continues to grow as a talented and dedicated family, whose positive energy will prosper for years to come.
